## HAWAII STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE OF VIEQUES

### AUGUST 19, 1999

Part of the legacy of colonialism is the severe impact of militarization. Puerto Rico, like Hawai'i, was taken over by the United States in 1898. Vieques, a small island off the coast of Puerto Rico's main island, is home to 9300 residents. Seventy-two percent of the population live below poverty level. Unemployment is at 50%. Cancer rates are at least 30% higher than the rest of Puerto Rico.

Present since the 1940s, the Navy now controls nearly 3/4 of the island. On April 19, 1999, two 500-pound bombs missed their target in a Navy exercise and caused the death of civilian security guard David Sanes Rodrigues. This event ignited the long-smoldering fires of decades of struggle by the people of Vieques.

In solidarity with the people of Vieques, we support their efforts to create an island community which is based on peace and justice, rather than war.

We call upon the United States government to immediately end all military operations on the island of Vieques, Puerto Rico.

We add our voices to those in Puerto Rico now speaking out and engaging in various forms of active resistance. These include the highest level of elected officials, leadership of the catholic church, trade union groups, fishermen, university professors, and thousands of grassroots Puerto Rican residents.

We support the Vieques community's insistence on:

- Demilitarization
- Decontamination
- Devolution (return of the lands to the people)
- Development (sustainable)

The situation in Vieques has numerous parallels to what has occurred/is occurring in Hawai'i, Okinawa, the Marshall Islands, the Philippines, Panama, and other territories. Such military actions which are so profoundly destructive to human, environmental, and cultural resources violate basic human rights. It is time to end the invasion!



## **DECLARACIÓN DEL PUEBLO DE HAWAI'I EN SOLIDARIDAD CON EL PUEBLO DE VIEQUES**

Parte de la herencia del colonialismo es el impacto severo del militarismo. Puerto Rico, lo mismo que Hawai'i, fue apoderado por EU en 1898. Vieques es una isla chica cerca de la costa de Puerto Rico donde viven 9,300 personas. Setenta y dos porciento de los que viven ahí tienen un nivel económico muy bajo. El desempleo está a cincuenta porciento. La cantidad de personas que sufren de cáncer es cuando menos treinta porciento más alto que en Puerto Rico.

Desde 1940, la Marina de Guerra de EU controla tres cuartos de la isla. Dos bombas de 500 libras que fallaron el objeto en un ejercicio de la Marina de Guerra y causaron la muerte de un guardia civil llamado David Sanes Rodrigues. Esta tragedia fué encender la resistencia ardiente latente por muchos años.

En solidaridad con el pueblo de Vieques, nosostros apoyamos el esfuerzo para construir una comunidad de la isla que es basada en la paz y justicia, en vez de guerra y violencia.

Exijimos al gobierno de EU que cese inmediata todas las actividades militares en la isla de Vieques, Puerto Rico.

Nosotros unimos nuestras voces a nuestros compañeros de Puerto Rico que están luchando en varias formas. Esto incluye políticos en puestos altos, autoridades de la iglesia Católica, los sindicatos, los pescadores, los profesores de la universidad, y miles de Puertorriqueños.

Nosotros apoyamos la comunidad de Vieques e insistimos en:

- Demilitarización
- Decontaminación
- Devolución (de las tierras de el pueblo)
- Desarrollo (ecológicamente)

La situación en Vieques paralela lo que está ocurriendo en Hawai'i, Okinawa, las Islas Marshall, las Filipinas, Panamá y otros territorios. Estas acciones militares que son profundamente destructivas a las personas, el ambiente, y los recursos culturales violan los derechos humanos fundamentales. ¡Ya es tiempo que termine la invasión!
